World Environment Day Quiz Competition 2026

1. Introduction & Background –

To observe World Environment Day on 5 June 2026, Mahatma Gandhi College, Darbhanga organised the World Environment Day Quiz Competition 2026. The initiative was conceptualised to move beyond ceremonial observances and to foster substantive academic engagement with critical environmental issues. Situated in Bihar's Mithila region, where challenges of water scarcity, climate variability, deforestation, and biodiversity loss have direct bearing on agrarian livelihoods, the college identified a gap between students' symbolic concern for the environment and their informed understanding of concepts such as sustainable development, carbon footprint, pollution control, waste management, and conservation of natural resources. Accordingly, an inter-college online quiz was structured as a democratic and inclusive platform, open to all students without registration fee or institutional restriction, reflecting the principle that environmental awareness must be accessible to every learner. Conducted on a zero-budget model through voluntary faculty contribution, the quiz addressed themes of ecology, climate change, renewable energy, circular economy, and India's environmental policy framework. Its objective was to position the environment not merely as an academic subject, but as a shared responsibility requiring informed action. The competition recorded participation from 86 students across various colleges, of whom 82 participants successfully qualified. This outcome indicates strong learning engagement and awareness. This background provides the context for the report that follows, documenting an event in which environmental consciousness was translated into active learning and sustainable values were reinforced through academic practice.

The event was executed using existing digital infrastructure and voluntary support from faculty members. No financial burden was placed on any stakeholder.

5. Outcome & Achievements

1. 95.35% Success Rate: 82 out of 86 participants secured 50% or above.
2. Inter-College Engagement: Participation from multiple institutions promoted constitutional literacy.
3. Zero-Cost Model: Proved that impactful academic events can be organized without financial resources.
4. Academic Rigor: With 30 questions and 50% cutoff, the quiz maintained standards while ensuring inclusivity.

6. Certificate Distribution

Certificates of Appreciation were digitally issued to the 82 students who scored 15 marks or above. The certificate recognised their active participation and qualifying understanding of key environmental concepts including climate change, sustainability, conservation, and pollution control. The remaining 4 students who did not meet the qualifying criteria were encouraged to participate in future academic and environmental awareness events to strengthen their knowledge base.

The 95.35% pass rate reflects not just academic preparation but also genuine concern among students to understand sustainability, climate change, conservation, and pollution control beyond textbook definitions. By covering themes of ecology, renewable energy, waste management, and India's environmental policies, the quiz encouraged participants to view the environment as a shared responsibility rather than a distant subject.

A defining feature of this initiative was its zero-budget, zero-fee model. Without any financial support from the college, external organisations, or students, the quiz was executed entirely through voluntary faculty efforts and existing digital infrastructure. This proved that impactful academic engagement does not require monetary resources but relies on institutional intent, planning, and collective responsibility. It also embodied the World Environment Day principle that environmental awareness and action must be accessible to all, irrespective of economic background.

Beyond numbers, the quiz fostered inter-college dialogue and environmental literacy at a time when climate action needs active reinforcement among youth. It reminded participants that the 2026 theme "Beat Plastic Pollution" and the broader call for sustainable living are not slogans but practices for long-term survival. For Mahatma Gandhi College, this event reaffirms the institution's commitment to value-based education and its role in nurturing informed, responsible citizens. The organising committee believes that such initiatives should become a regular practice, ensuring that World Environment Day is observed not merely as a ceremony but as an annual renewal of our commitment to the planet. The success of this quiz encourages us to expand such efforts in the future.

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
